Worst time: Lunchtime, Saturdays, and of course the end of the month.

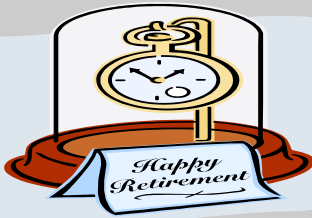
